*Pregnancy that follows the loss of a baby is a complex journey. The majority of couples will go on to achieve a subsequent pregnancy within a short timeframe. Navigating the ability to trust all will go well when the previous pregnancy ended in loss or failed attempts after infertility treatments can be daunting. This presentation will explore traditional and non-traditional relationships in a pregnancy following loss; how couples negotiating the multi-factorial decision making process in achieving a subsequent pregnancy after loss as well as the reproductive challenges including single parenthood by choice. Regardless of the different experiences of loss, grief, deciding and planning for a new baby fear and anxiety of another loss are common concerns for everyone. We will present parents' embodied experience of pregnancy following loss and provide an overview of a prenatal attachment intervention supporting the reciprocal relationship that is developing between parents and an unborn baby. The challenge becomes how to embrace a new unborn baby alongside continued grief while honouring and making meaning of the continued parental relationship for their deceased baby. *Raising children is an intense job with a lot of responsibility. As parents we often tend to get overwhelmed by our to do's and (parental) stress. This prevents us from being truly present with our children. In these moments we seem to be parenting on autopilot and often respond emotionally. When struggling with mental health issues emotion regulation is even more difficult, which in turn can lead to a lesser degree of sensitive responsiveness and a lesser bond with the child. Mindful Parenting (Bögels & Restifo, 2013) is an ongoing process in which we try to approach each moment with a beginner's mind, with an emphasis on moments where parenthood plays a central part. It teaches parents to truly connect with themselves and their children as well as mindfully paying attention to the interactions between parent and child. In this workshop we'll firstly attempt to give insight into how we've adapted Mindful Parenting to the needs and the reality of mothers with postpartum psychiatric problems and their infants. Secondly, we'll let you get acquainted with the specific techniques that are used. And lastly, we'll discuss why mindful parenting could be beneficial when working with mothers with mental health problems.*

Girls report emotional problems almost twice as often as boys do. Also, they more often have psychosomatic problems and report a significantly lower life satisfaction. More in particular gender differences between boys and girls exist, when it comes to mental health issues such as anxiety, depression, eating disorders and autism. Following the latest results from the HBSC study (2022) on mental health trends among young people, the documentary 'Thirteen' by Lisa Grooters and Marrie Bekker's work on gender, mental health, and autonomy-enhancing treatment (AET), we will discuss the socio-cultural factors that may underlie these sex and gender differences in mental health.

Film maker Lisa Grooters will talk about her personal experiences with mental healthcare and what she has tried to capture with her documentary.
